LMC Member Terry Kelley’s  
Magical Mission Trip

*Terry will be traveling to Poland again in June. I thought you would like to hear about his previous trips. - Editor*



I went to Poland twice in 2006 to perform and teach magic, juggling, and balloons twisting to a group of youth from all over Poland. The conference is called Creations International and is a creative ministries training conference. Besides myself there we others teaching drama, dance, lip sync, and puppets, we had over 100 youth attend the conference.

The magic I taught in Poland was all pretty simple and most of the prop could be found in any hardware or grocery store, being as there is only one magic store in Poland. I taught tricks using cards, coins, rope, and marbles. The tricks taught using cards included using a key card, the cut deeper force, Hindu shuffle, slip force, and top card palm. The tricks taught using coins were retention vanish, thumb palm, and Bobo switch (I also explained you could do this with marbles or other small objects). The tricks taught using rope were the hunter bow knot and the professors’ nightmare. I also taught the 1 to 6 force and showed how you could use it not only to perform a trick like the “Hot Rod” but also use it to embellish a card trick or other magical effect. I learned that this trick doesn’t work in Polish because of the differences in the numbers, but most of the youth and young adult speak English. The youth really enjoyed learning and didn’t want the


classes to end.

While in Poland the first time besides performing at the conferences, I performed 9 shows in schools 7 in high schools and two in what they call gymnasium our elementary age. I felt like a real celebrity at the gymnasium shows the children and teachers surrounded me as I was leaving and I signed autographs for about a half hour, I found it funny that the teachers and principal wanted autographs as well. When I returned the second time right before Halloween to one of the gymnasium schools some of the children saw me coming and you could here them shouting “He’s back”, and telling students that had not been there the first time “He’s cool” this made me feel great.

Since I have now brought up the second trip I will tell you all a little about that trip. The second trip was a performance only trip and involved traveling literally from border to border and performing 20 plus times. I also went to Sweden and performed there twice. I had a lot of fun on the second trip not just putting on shows but street performing. It was great because most of them had only seen magic on TV and I got a lot of big reactions (I felt a little like Chris Angel or David Blane HAHA).

I learned a lot from both trips, like working thru and interpreter, what magic plays well with an interpreter and what does not work. I learned what to pack in your carry on and what NOT to pack in your carry on if you don’t want to be answering questions (Pom Pom Pole--go figure). I also learned that magic is universal and every where I have been they enjoy it, I have been in nine countries now performing.




